Section 1



May - Month for Mary

For Catholics the month of May, is given to Mary, the Mother of Jesus. Catholics have a great devotion to Mary and pray to her to intercede for their prayers. During the month of May, Catholics will spend time praying to the Blessed Mother. Catholics pray to Mary daily but the months of May and October are especially devoted to her.

Mary's importance is acknowledged in all the Catholic church doctrines (teachings). All of these emphasise Mary's closeness to God, something which most Catholics aspire to have .

Catholics and Protestants accept the Virgin Birth. They teach that Jesus was conceived through the power of the Holy Spirit and born to Mary while she was still a virgin. This is called the Virgin Birth

Catholic teaching about Mary includes two doctrines which Protestants don't accept. These doctrines have been declared *dogmas* of the Catholic Church, this means that they *infallible teachings which must be accepted by all Catholics*.

These are the Immaculate Conception and the Assumption.

The Immaculate Conception

This was a dogma in the Church since 1854. This means that from the moment of her conception in her mother's womb, Mary was without sin of any kind. She was totally pure of heart, gentle and loving. Therefore, Mary was fit person to be the mother of the Son of God.

The Assumption

This was a dogma in 1950. This means because of her unique role in human history as the mother of Jesus, Mary was *assumed* into heaven. This means she was taken full body and soul into Heaven. For Catholics, Mary gives them hope that one day, all those who have lived according the Gospel message they too, will share in the eternal life of Jesus.

and carried our sorrows
to lead us, through the cross,
to the joy of the resurrection. Amen.
Under your protection, we seek refuge, Holy Mother of God. Do not disdain the
entreaties of we who are in trial, but deliver us from every danger, O glorious
and blessed Virgin.

Pilgrimage

80% of Catholic places of Pilgrimage are dedicated to Mary. Each year millions of pilgrims world wide flock to the many **Marian Shrines**. A **Marian Shrine**, is a shrine dedicated to Mary. Many of these places have become centres of pilgrimage because it is believed to that Mary herself appeared there. This is called an **apparition**.

The following places are Marian Shrines:

Guadalupe in Mexico

Knock in Ireland

Aparecida in Brazil

Lourdes in France

Fatima in Portugal.

TASK 2 Faith in Action
